Objectives and Investment Policy

The Fund's investment objective is to achieve long-term capital growth appreciation by seeking to outperform the MSCI Emerging Markets Index (the "Benchmark").

The objective of the Fund may be achieved by primarily gaining indirect exposure (through the use of collective investment schemes) to a diversified portfolio of emerging market equity and equity-related securities. Direct exposure may also be taken to such asset classes if this is considered to be more efficient. The Fund can invest up to 100% of the Net Asset Value in emerging market equities and equity-related securities (including common stock, American depositary receipts and global depository receipts, equity linked notes, and rights (which allow holders to subscribe for additional securities of the issuer)), which are listed on a Recognised Exchange worldwide.

The Fund may invest up to 75% of its Net Asset Value in collective investment schemes, including money market funds and exchange traded funds (which are eligible for investment by a UCITS).

The Fund may also hold cash or ancillary liquid assets (comprising short-term money market instruments which will be listed on a Recognised Exchange, bank deposits and cash equivalents) for cash management purposes, as cover for derivative exposure, pending investment or in anticipation of future redemptions. It is possible that up to 100% of the Net Asset Value of the Fund may be held directly or indirectly (via investment in collective investment schemes) in cash or money market instruments at any time.

The Fund may use financial derivative instruments for efficient portfolio management. The financial derivative instruments used by the Fund will be exchange traded futures and swaps. Financial derivative instruments may be traded on a Recognised Exchange or over-the-counter. Investment will focus on large-cap and mid-cap equity and equity related securities in emerging markets that closely resemble the capitalisation composition of the Benchmark across countries and

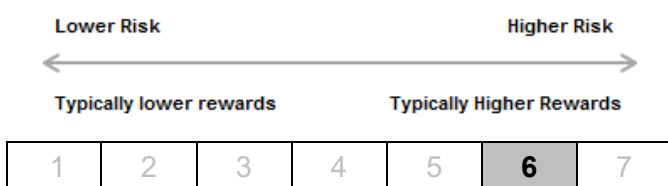
sectors. The Fund is considered to be actively managed in reference to the Benchmark by virtue of the fact that it seeks to outperform the Benchmark and it uses the Benchmark as a universe from which to select securities (while at the same time seeking enhancement opportunities).

The majority of the Fund's securities may be components of and may have similar weightings to the Benchmark, however, the Investment Manager may use its discretion to invest in equity securities in order to take advantage of specific investment opportunities. Any income arising from the Fund will be reinvested and it is not intended that the Fund will pay dividends.

The Fund is suitable for investors that seek long-term capital growth and can accept the volatility in capital values expected from a diversified emerging market portfolio.

These investors will typically have a medium to high-risk profile. You may buy and sell shares in the Fund on each Business Day in Ireland. Unless otherwise defined in this document, all words and expressions defined in the ICAV's current Prospectus shall have the same meaning herein. Risk and Reward Profile of the Fund

In addition to the risk captured by the indicator, the overall Fund value may be considerably affected by:

- **Liquidity Risk** – certain stock markets have low liquidity which means it may be more difficult to buy or sell shares than on a more developed market.
- **Currency Risk** - the Fund may be exposed to currency risk in relation the valuation of assets held in currencies other than its base currency.
- **Stock Market Risk** – the Fund is subject to stock market risk,

which is the chance that stock prices overall, will decline. Stock markets tend to move in cycles, with periods of rising prices and periods of falling prices.

- **Country Risk**- The value of the Fund's assets may be affected by uncertainties such as changes in a country's government policies, taxation, restrictions on foreign investment, currency decisions, applicable laws and regulations, together with any natural disasters or political upheaval, which could weaken a country's securities markets.
- **Settlement Risk** - reliability of trading and settlement systems may not be the same as more developed markets, resulting in delays in receiving proceeds when selling shares.

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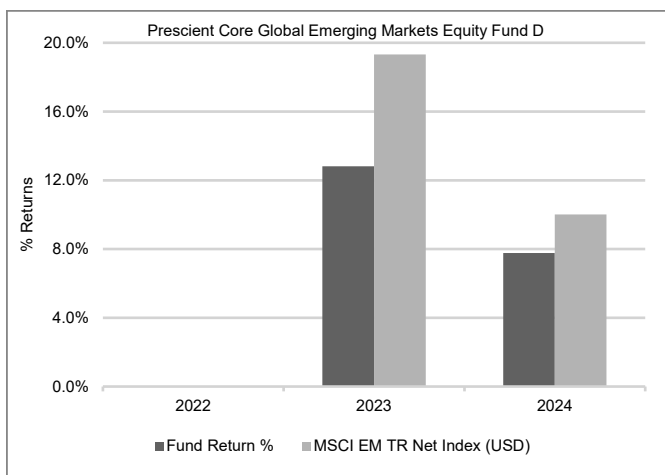
